# JOTTINGS FROM A COUNTRY CHURCHYARD

A REALLY CHEERFUL JOTTING to start with a hearty thank you to all who so generously supported my two garage sales which resulted in £88.06 going to Chantry church and £108.50 to Dogs' Trust. Well worth while. Thank you everyone!

As I write this (<u>not</u> in the stable yard!) we seem to be in the throes of a rainy and gloomy autumn. But what a year it has been harvest. Officially a "mast" year but not just beech mast – every fruiting, nutting and berrying tree and bush has excelled itself. Most of us are tired of offering each other baskets of produce, and the frugal among us with time and energy have larder shelves stocked with jams, chutneys and bottled fruit. And how much more flavoursome the fruit picked from the trees in ripe perfection than the perfect supermarket warehouse-ripened specimens. They may not look so perfect but what does appearance matter?

Some ten years or so ago, horrified that one third of farm produce went to landfill if it didn't confirm to supermarket standards of visual perfection, I was fired by the idea of selling imperfect goods of a market stall and working up to first one small shop and eventually a chain of shops called "Wonkeys". I visualised such shops becoming nationally popular – "get it at Wonkeys", rather like the 1930s entrepreneur (what was his name?) who started with a market barrow and ended with a national chain of shops with his slogan "pile it high and sell it cheap".

I even negotiated for a partner for financial backing, but such enterprises also involve also sourcing the goods, transport, storage, volunteers, premises and so on. Then came Covid and lockdown and my endometrial and long treatment. By the time that was all over, I was past 90 and had "run out of steam". Thankfully, nowadays much imperfect foodstuff is used by charities offering free meals or in schools, care homes and food banks. But it isn't just food that gets discarded. Clothing and footwear with the slightest imperfection is swept off the production line, kitchen ware, china, cutlery too. Why this emphasis on perfection nowadays? Nothing in the world is perfect. And wouldn't it be boring if it were? What would we have to grumble about?



#### RACHEL CLARKE, 1945-2025

On Thursday October 30th, 2025, a burial service took place in St Michael's Church to give thanks for the life of Mrs Rachel Clarke. The service was rung in by ringers from the Corsley team and *streamed live to Rachel's family in the North of England and Australia*.

Rachel's coffin was covered with flowers of her favourite colours of pink, blue and white. Behind the coffin, letters made from white chrysanthemums. spelled out the word 'Granny'.

The service, designed by Rachel herself, was conducted by the Reverend Pauline Reid. Hymns were Love divine All Loves Excelling, Dear Lord and Father of Mankind, One More Step Along the World I Go and The Lord's My Shepherd. At the end of the service the coffin was carried out to a recording of the great hymn Guide Me O Thou Great Redeemer.

Scripture readings were John 6:35-40 read by Mark and 1 Corinthians 13 read by Elspeth. Nicolle read the poem *The Life that I Have* by Leopold Marks.

The Eulogy consisted of a recorded message from Emma, Anne's daughter-in-law, in Australia. In a moving tribute, Emma paid tribute to Rachel's unfailing love and support for her family. In her address, Pauline reflected on how the reading from Corinthians was perfect for Rachel as a description of what love really means.

Rachel joined the Young Friends community in 1960 and was a member of CND, memorably leading her classmates in a walkout to join the CND march in Swansea at the time of the Cuban missile crisis in 1962. This commitment to peace and tolerance, along with a strong sense of responsibility and the need to help others, stayed with her throughout her life.

Rachel enjoyed the company of children and taught at Bath School for Girls, where she is still remembered.

When her sons emigrated to Australia, Rachel enjoyed visiting her family there and was a much-loved grandmother and great grandmother, never forgetting birthdays and Christmases. Her connection with her sisters remained close, with weekly Zoom calls during Covid and letters when she became ill, and she described her marriage to Ken as '30 years of love'.

Pauline acknowledged that there is no sticking plaster to fix the pain of losing someone so loved, and that it will be hard for her family to learn to live without her but she reminded us that God weeps with us and comforts us in difficult times. We know that love is stronger than death, and Rachel's love will continue to sustain her family in the years to come. Donations were made to Dorothy House. Rachel was buried in the churchyard close to her home. Our thoughts and prayers are with her husband and family at this time. *Jenny Waller, Churchwarden*.

The annual Toy and Carol Service will take place on Sunday December 14th at 11.00am. As usual we are asking for donations of children's toys and games.





**Cost-of-living support available for Somerset residents this winter:** Somerset Council is again distributing funds to provide immediate, practical help during a time when many are





facing financial hardship or support for older residents and those with disabilities. Funds are available for Free School Meal vouchers during school holidays, food, fuel and essential items available through an online portal, emergency grants for crisis situations, hospital discharge support and council tax relief, specialist advice and outreach from trusted partners like Age UK, Citizens Advice Somerset, and SASP and Thrive, community hubs offering warm spaces, meals, budgeting support, and more. Support is available both online and in-person. To apply <a href="https://www.somerset.gov.uk/cost-of-living-support">www.somerset.gov.uk/cost-of-living-support</a> or call 0300 123 2224 and ask for 'cost of living crisis support'.

**Council Ready for Winter Road Conditions:** Somerset Council and Kier Transportation Ltd have completed preparations for the cold season. The council prioritises a precautionary network of major roads, emergency routes and community links. #### MATTERS ARISING

Litter bin by bus shelter: This has now been installed in the bus shelter.

Loose dogs bothering sheep: Signage has been put up and awareness of the issue put on Mells Matter. To be monitored.

Lamp out in Vobster: This has now been repaired.

#### HIGHWAY AND FOOTPATH ISSUES:

Layby by Vobster bus shelter: Cllr West met Charlie Higgins from Highways to discuss the works. A plan of action has been submitted today for approval and the works will be undertaken once a date has been approved.

#### PLANNING

2025/1913/TCA: Pruning of sycamore branches – Ems Cottage. Notification only 2025/1845/FUL & 2025/1846/LBC: Like for like replacement of existing ground floor timber windows – Mells C of E Primary School – no objections.

**FINANCE - Preliminary budget and precept discussion:** Cllr Earl is keen to bring the village up to the standard of other local villages and for the parish council to have the financial ability to fund more projects to ensure the village environment is pleasant for all. This can only be done by increasing the precept quite substantially to bring it in line with other local parishes. An increase of £10,000 to take the precept from £16,500 to £26,500 would place an additional 64p/week (£33.33/annum) on the council tax. This increase would allow the council to contribute to improving the play area, supporting the recreation ground/pavilion more, helping the church, grants for local projects and assisting with the costs of reducing the speed limit in Vobster.
